

# Celebrating National Friends of Libraries Week!





The 17<sup>th</sup> annual National Friends of Libraries Week takes place **October 16-22** this year. This is a great opportunity to celebrate our own wonderful Friends group at the Olean Public Library!

The Friends of the Olean Library is a dedicated group of volunteers who work hard all year long providing financial support to the Library. They also assist at Library programs, in addition to running some of their own popular events, such as the annual bookmark contest and awards ceremony, and the poetry contest. both of which run in coordination with area schools.

Over the past 5 years, the Friends have been running two amazing annual fundraisers to benefit the Library—Read Between the Wines in September, and FeBREWary, a beer tasting event in February. The two events have grown in popularity over the years, drawing large crowds eager for an evening of fun, good food and drinks, music, and the popular basket raffle, all of which raise thousands of dollars for the Library each year.

Some of the many ways the Friends give to the Library include an annual Book Endowment gift to purchase circulating materials—not only books, but also audiobooks, DVDs, and music CDs. They provide funds to support programs for the public, including the Summer Reading Program. They also assist with purchasing technology, equipment, furniture, and other items.

This year, the Friends have already given nearly \$20,000 to support the Library's collections, programs, and technology! They also helped sponsor best-selling author Susan Wiggs' visit to Olean in April, which was attended by over 120 people and was extremely well-received.

Finally, the Friends supply the snacks and beverages for the popular Brown Bag Book Club, which meets the third Monday of every month at 12:30 pm in the Gallery. October's book is *The Last Thing He Told Me*, by Laura Dave. Pick up your copy today and be sure to join us for a lively discussion! Bring your lunch, or nibble on some of the sweet treats provided by the Friends.




