This is through the company GlobalVRS, the FCC’s video relay service. **Our videophone number is: 585-376-1096.** This can only be used to receive calls on a GlobalVRS videophone. Simply ask at the information desk to use it!

Reading Can Be Ruff Book Club

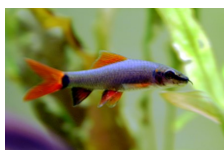
Tuesdays at 6:30 pm or Wednesdays at 3:30 pm

Thanks to all the kids who voted to name our fish this summer! These new names will help distinguish our fish from one another and make our aquarium even more fun! Here are the winning names:



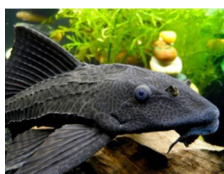

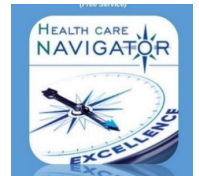
Social Security Benefits Workshop

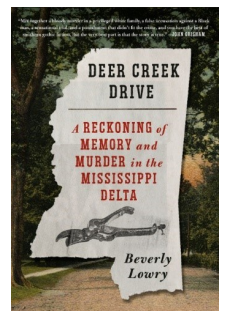


The Race Unity Circle of Olean Book Club
