A Note of Thanks

from the Friends of the Library

From the Friends of the Library board: We asked – and wow, did you answer! Your generosity helped us shatter our goal for Giving Tuesday, Nov. 30. We had hoped to raise \$1,000 for the Born to Read program, but at the end of the day, 35 donors had helped us raise \$3,145!

Our generous donors won for us the Olean Area Federal Credit Union prize for the most donations between 5 and 6 p.m. That \$500 prize is part of the \$3,145 total. We were among 40 non-profit organizations taking part in the local Giving Tuesday.

Born to Read is a program Friends has offered for a number of years. The program provides a bright-colored packet of information, plus a board book, for parents-to-be. The packets encourage the new parents to read to babies from the start of their lives and to get the family a library card. They receive the packet when they are discharged from Olean General Hospital.

Friends' involvement with Born to Read was the idea of a former board member, the late Marge Nevins. Marge introduced us to the Born to Read program, coordinated our efforts with the people at Olean General Hospital, and encouraged parents-to-be to bring books to their babies early.

We thank you for helping us to keep Marge's dream going strong.

December – January: Winter Reading Program! Ask at the circulation desk or check our website to print the Winter Reading Bingo Board.



Anime Club | Thursday, January 27 | 6:00 pm in the Gallery


Anime Club is back in January! We are always taking suggestions for what anime to watch, and snacks are provided!






New York History Film Series | Thursday, January 6 | 7:00 pm in the Gallery

Must be 18+ to play, unless accompanied by an adult. Join us for three rounds of trivia, plus a bonus question. Winner receives a prize!






Brain Dance Movement with Benjamin Berry | Thursday, January 20 | 1:00 pm in the Gallery

Beginning American Sign Language Class

Tuesdays February 1, 8, 15 and March 1, 8 and 15, (NO CLASS February 22) from 6:30 to 7:30 pm in the Olean Public Library's gallery. Call 716-372-0200 to register for class. ASL Instructor Brittany Hutley will lead us in this 6-week ASL workshop series where you will learn basic techniques on how to communicate with people who are



deaf or hard of hearing. Made available through the Outreach Department of the library, this class is free to the public as a way to promote inclusion in the community to ensure fairness, and increase accessibility to our businesses and workplaces for those who may be deaf or hard of hearing, or might communicate differently. Conversations Save Lives is The Race Unity Circle of Olean's January topic of discussion. The program will take place on January 13 at 6:30 pm at the Olean Public Library.

Justin Hubbard, a Social Studies teacher at Salamanca High School will discuss community and culturally responsive teaching. Mr. Hubbard is also the faculty advisor of the **Salamanca Student Activist** club which gives students the opportunity to discuss social justice issues in their school and community and actively work on solutions. This club was responsible for erecting the Progress Pride Flag at Salamanca High School at the end of last school year.

Mr. Hubbard is also the faculty advisor for the Civic Engagement Program and the NYS Seal of Civic Readiness Pilot program. Both of these programs emphasize civic education and participation as a way to address the growing polarization and tribalism in our nation as well as an overall lack of community and culturally relevant civic education in our current K-12 Social Studies classes.

Mr. Hubbard is a graduate of Jamestown Community College and SUNY Fredonia and has a Bachelor's in Social Studies Education and History and a Master's in Literacy Education.
