John Rybicki was born in Detroit, Michigan. He is the author of three poetry collections: When All the World Is Old, Traveling at High Speeds, and We Bed Down into Water, all of which are available to read through the library. His poems have been published in The Best American

Poetry 2008, Alaska Quarterly Review, Field, Paris Review, and Poetry magazine.

Rybicki teaches poetry to young writers through the InsideOut literary arts project and Wings of Hope Hospice. He is a writer-in-residence at Alma College in Michigan.

In the Gallery in March: Daniel R. Jordan's Wildlife Photography

Daniel is a professional photographer with a portrait studio in Olean. A retired chemist with a passion for photographing wildlife, Dan is a member of the Twin Tiers Camera Club. He was first introduced to photography by world famous photographer, Craig Melvin. He bought a Sony camera with 1.2 megapixels and began his passion project.



Daniel's first foray into photography was seeing a bald eagle in his front lawn. He grabbed his camera and took half a dozen photos before it flew away. He now has taken close to 300,000 photos of bald eagles alone, mostly located in Western New York and Northwest Pennsylvania.

This specific exhibit of Dan's will feature photos of a range of subjects, including songbirds, herons, hawks, vultures, beavers, highland cattle, and of course, bald eagles.

Daniel will be hosting a reception for his artwork on Thursday, March 2nd at 4:30 pm in the Kart Gallery. Stop by to discuss his work with him and ask any questions. Refreshments will be served.


We have every party pack available to play! Bring a device and your thinking caps to compete with other teens. The family filter is kept on throughout, and answers must be library appropriate.
