

<u>Week Four:</u> Social Media, Internet Safety, Privacy. Email knowledge is required. Topics covered: social media platforms, privacy settings, social etiquette, algorithms, private messaging, sharing posts. April 27th at 12:30 pm OR April 28th at 4 pm.

Amber Flora Thomas is a mixed-race African American poet who has authored three collections of poetry, including Eye of Water, which won the Cave Canem Poetry Prize, The Rabbits Could Sing, and most recently Red Channel in the Rupture. Presenting April 6th at 7pm, via Zoom, she will read from her published works and take questions. A recipient of the Dylan Thomas American Poet Prize, the Richard Peterson Prize, and the Ann Stanford Prize, her poetry has appeared in numerous journals and anthologies. Thomas is a Cave Canem fellow and faculty member. She regularly teaches at


the Bread Loaf Environmental Writers Conference. She has received fellowships from Yaddo, Atlantic Center for the Arts, Bread Loaf Writers Conference, and Sewanee Writers Conference. She earned an MFA at Washington University in St. Louis, MO. Currently, she is an Associate Professor of Creative Writing at East Carolina University in Greenville, North Carolina. Book selection: <u>The Third Reconstruction: America's Struggle for Racial Justice in the Twenty-First Century</u> by Peniel E. Joseph

In <u>The Third Reconstruction</u>, distinguished historian Peniel E. Joseph offers a powerful and personal new interpretation of recent history. The racial reckoning that unfolded in 2020, he argues, marked the climax of a Third Reconstruction: a new struggle for citizenship and dignity for Black Americans, just as momentous as the movements that arose after the Civil War and during the civil rights era.

WHAT'S YOUR LIBRARY WORTH TO YOU?

Need information or have an opportunity to enjoy some relaxation time?

The Library saved the Olean community **\$1,520,400** by loaning books that individuals would have otherwise had to purchase for an average cost of **\$20** each!

Contemplating another streaming subscription?

The Olean Public Library maintains a huge DVD collection and stays up to date with the latest DVD releases of your favorite streaming series. In 2022 we circulated **17,829** DVDs (including popular series) for free, a value to the Community of **\$71,316**. A family that borrows 3 DVDs a week would pay \$72 a month for those same movies rented through an On-Demand streaming service: a total savings of **\$864 per year!**

Looking for affordable quality entertainment for your family and friends?

In 2022 the Library offered **185** free children's programs providing **\$15,988** in value to the 2,284 Attendees! 4,570 attendees saved a total of **\$54,840** by attending our free adult and family programs!

Trying to make the community better by running a non-profit?

Olean area non-profit groups saved \$7,210 dollars in 2022 by using Olean Public Library's meeting rooms free of charge, compared to \$35/hour at many other venues!

Can't afford the Internet at home, or don't want to buy your own printer?

The Olean Public Library provided **5,593** free WiFi sessions in 2022. Over 8,002 sessions, library users saved **\$96,024** by using library computers for everything from printing family photos, applying for jobs, or checking their e-mail!

Enjoy E-Audio Books?

In 2022 the Library provided **\$231,030** in value by providing **7,701** E-Audio book circulations free of charge!
