# Book Your Summer at the Olean Public Library! *All Together Now 2023* begins July 10th! Read to earn Kid Cash for prizes! Fun Programs and Special Events for all ages!

#### Introducing All Together Now Kids and Clay: Hand Building!

Kids ages 6-10 will learn how to take raw clay, form it, and make it into something really cool—like a Pout Pout Fish kitchen scrubby holder! The class will be taught by local artisan Tara Dedrick. Tara began her pottery journey 10 years ago when she was gifted an instructional class, and hasn't looked back since! She now passes her passion for pottery forward to others. "Everyone can enjoy and create with clay, and have fun and learn at the same time!"



Tara has been giving pottery lessons for over 6 years and recently moved to teaching classes out of her little studio called TShed Pottery in Allegany. Tara donates 100% of her pottery sales to Olean missionary Cari Matejka's Literacy of Love organization in Uganda. Each class will be approximately 2 hours long and one project will be created in each class. Parents can stay and assist. Registration is required. Please only sign up for one session to allow for more kids to participate.






Adult D&D Session | Saturday, June 10 | 1:00 p.m. in the Gallery
