


# May **Newsletter**

# Bookmark Contest Winners on Display in Art Gallery Throughout May!

Where do you read? Area students in grades one through five show off their answers in artwork on display through the month of May in the gallery at the Olean Public Library.

The artwork appears in the form of bookmarks, entered by the students in the Peg Bothner Bookmark Contest. The contest, sponsored by the Friends of the Olean Library, is open to students in grades one through five. This year, entries came from two Olean schools - Intermediate Middle and East View Elementary - plus Allegany-Limestone and Portville.

Chosen as school-wide winners were Daks Perry from Olean Intermediate Middle School; Nolan Mangalsingh, East View Elementary; Livia Laing, Portville Elementary; and Emily Fries, Allegany-Limestone Elementary.

# Tuesdays at 6:30 pm or Wednesdays at 3:30 pm








# The Race Unity Circle of Olean Book Club @ the library May 17th @ 1pm
