#### 3D Printing Now Available at the Library!

The Olean Public Library recently received two QIDI 3D printers as a donation from Boundless Connections. These are now available to the public for printing! The Library provides Sunlu PLA filament, defaulted to black.

Requirements of printing include, but are not limited to:

- Patron account must be in good standing
- Patrons must provide a workable .STL file no greater than 25MB, submitted on working USB drive
- Print time cannot exceed five hours
- Print size should not exceed 6" in all dimensions
- 1 item per patron per week
- Patrons must clean rafts and supports

The price for utilizing the 3D printer is currently \$0.20/gram of filament used in final print plus \$1.00 printing fee. This price is subject to change.

Bring your friends and family to play. Anyone is welcome! We play three rounds and a bonus question. You can play by yourself or with a team. Winning team always gets a prize!






# How many libraries will you visit?

**Book selection:** Having Our Say: The Delany Sisters' First 100 Years by Sarah L. Delany, A. Elizabeth Delany, Amy Hill Hearth.

Warm, feisty, and intelligent, the Delany sisters speak their mind in a book that is at once a vital historical record and a moving portrait of two remarkable women who continued to love, laugh, and embrace life after over a hundred years of living side-by-side. Their sharp memories show us the post-Reconstruction South and Booker T. Washington; Harlem's Golden Age and Langston Hughes, W.E.B. DuBois, and Paul Robeson. Bessie breaks barriers to become a dentist; Sadie quietly integrates the New York City system as a high school teacher. Their extraordinary story makes an important contribution to our nation's heritage—and an indelible impression on our lives.
