
Wrap & Yap | Saturday, December 16 | 2:30-4:30 p.m. in the Gallery

She works with contractors. PUSH green, and other partners

to help residents find the right programs to help weatherize and insulate their homes, install different heating and cooling equipment, save on energy costs, or talk about rooftop and community solar. The program helps residents of low to moderate income, disadvantaged communities, and small minority and women owned businesses find out information of the services offered and what finances can help improve their household. Information or assistance to free or reduced cost energy assessments, installation services, low-cost financing, and solar.
