

The Value of Your Library in 2023

Borrowing books from the library saved the Olean community \$769,284 over the purchase of adult fiction and non-fiction. The collection contains 89,547 adult books to choose from.

Coming in to borrow Children's books from the Library provides an opportunity for socialization, builds a sense of community, improves literacy, and saved parents nearly \$460,615 in 2023. Our collection contains 26,489 children's books to choose from.

Tired of paying higher prices for more commercials on your streaming services? Don't want to pay that auto renew for that one obscure show? Borrow that favorite series or movie from the Library!! Last year we provided the community with \$68,008 in value with our DVD collection and Kanopy streaming service at a value of \$4 per rent or stream. The library has 8,609 DVD's and videos to choose from.

Our meeting spaces saved non-profit groups over \$7,125 over the cost of renting, a value they are able to then pass on to the community. A total of 285 meetings were held by non-profits in 2023.








In 2023 there were:

- 91,036 visits to the library
- 8,907 attendees at 468 programs for adults, teens, and children
- 121,798 items were checked out
- 8,291 wifi sessions and 7,801 public computer sessions
