Cash prizes will be awarded for the winning poems in each grade from 9th through 12th. Poems may be on any topic but must be typed in a 12 point standard font such as Times New Roman. In the top left corner of the submitted poem, the author must include their full name, the school they attend, their current grade level, and their teacher's name along with the teacher's email address for contact. Poems may be submitted through the teachers or dropped off at the Olean Public Library marked for the attention of the Friends Poetry Contest on or before November 27th. Late entries can not be considered.

Poetry gives young writers a chance to express emotions. Poetry can be a friend, someone to talk to, a release of inner tensions. It helps us to understand ourselves. It promotes thinking in images and translating the visual and emotional into words as well as understanding metaphor.



Kidnapped from Africa as a child,

Aminata Diallo is enslaved in South Carolina but escapes during the chaos of the Revolutionary War. Manhattan she



becomes a scribe for the British, recording the names of blacks who have served the King and earned their freedom in Nova Scotia. But the hardship and prejudice of the new colony prompt her to follow her heart back to Africa, then on to London, where she bears witness to the injustices of slavery and its toll on her life and a whole people. It is a story that no listener, and no reader, will ever forget. Published in Canada as The Book of Negroes and the basis for the award-winning BET miniseries of the same name.

Starve a Vampire—Donate Blood!





"PAINTING WITH PAPER printmaking and collage converging" by Theresa Heinz



From her artist statement: "Collage, like our lives is multi-layered, with each layer or experience effecting the others. Currently, my work involves figures within specific settings. Some images are historic reflections of my family, others are more recent experiences around my environment. My goal is to position literal figures within a somewhat abstract, collaged background. The collage work involves drawing, painting, found objects, words and imagery. Intrigued by translucency, layering media, and working on colored ground, I anticipate the viewer will be drawn in both figuratively and literally by virtue of the scale and content of the images and words.

Collage allows me to "paint with paper," while satisfying the desire to work in translucent layers, allowing images and words to peek through. It also creates a diverse surface on which to paint, full of unexpected and certainly unplanned texture. Three-dimensional pieces within the work are a tangible refection of the collage images and drawings."
