# Re-Thinking Thanksgiving: Native American Views on an American Holiday

Monday November 4th: 6:00-7:30pm Perry Ground is a Turtle Clan member of the Onondaga Nation of the Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) Confederacy. Perry has been a storyteller and educator for over 25 years and enjoys working with people of all ages to teach about the history & culture of Native Peoples. This lively, content-based presentation will give an overview of the history of this very misunderstood holiday. Based on the only primary source document that chronicles the "First Thanksgiving" and using a quiz-style format (the audience will take the 'quiz' prior to the presentation), participants will learn accurate and culturally appropriate information about the English settlers at Plymouth and the Wampanoag, the Native people who inhabited that area.

The PowerPoint presentation will discuss the actual events of 1621 in Plymouth, the relationship between the English settlers and the Wampanoag and how this story became the holiday we know today. The concept of thanksgiving held by many Native Americans will be emphasized throughout. Although they were not present in Plymouth in 1621, connections to the Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) concepts of Thanksgiving will be discussed so participants will

understand how Native People view Thanksgiving today.



Book selection: White rural rage: the threat to American democracy by Tom Schaller and Paul Waldman

White rural voters hold the greatest electoral sway of any demographic group in the United States, yet rural communities suffer from poor healthcare access, failing infrastructure, and severe manufacturing and farming job losses. Rural voters believe our nation has betrayed them, and to some degree, they're right. In White Rural Rage, Tom Schaller and Paul Waldman explore why rural Whites have failed to reap the benefits from their outsized political power and why, as a result, they are the most likely group to abandon democratic norms and traditions.

Wednesday November 13th



Cattaraugus County Compeer is a friendship program that matches volunteers from the community with persons receiving treatment for mental health. The volunteer is cleared through background checks, references, and fingerprints, and must also complete a training regimen before meeting with their friend. Volunteers and Friends meet regularly 1:1 creating their own schedule and agenda together for any number of activities. Some go fishing or shopping, walk the bike trail or see a movie, they're simply being Friends. Compeer Volunteers will then have access to on-going education and support from Compeer Staff. # Art For Equity: A Creative Call for Economic Justice:

On October 18th, 2024, the First National Bank Studios of Olean hosted a multimedia performance titled "Art for Equity: A Creative Call for Economic

Justice" featuring a song by Clarissa Spiller, a performance piece by Carleigh Spiller, and a live painting by Dr. Fileve Tlaloc Palmer. The performance was meant to engage the community in meaningful dialogue about guaranteed income and social equity and featured an artist who had direct experience with such programs. Afterwards, participants were encouraged to participate in a collective collage.

For November, the Gallery will offer a recording of this presentation to view on demand. as well as displays of images and pieces from the performance. The collage, which is meant to be a collective expression of our thoughts. feelings, and hopes around guaranteed income and economic equity, will also be on display, and patrons are encouraged to add to the collage throughout the exhibit.


The library will host an opening reception on November 13th from 3:30-5:00pm in the Gallery.
