

### **Cooking Club**









## Art For Equity: A Creative Call for Economic Justice:

On October 18th, 2024, the First National Bank Studios of Olean hosted a multimedia performance titled "Art for Equity: A Creative Call for Economic Justice" featuring a song by Clarissa Spiller, a performance piece by Carleigh Spiller, and a live painting by Dr. Fileve Tlaloc Palmer. The performance was meant to engage the community in meaningful dialogue about guaranteed income and social equity and featured an artist who had direct experience with such programs. Afterwards, participants were encouraged to participate in a collective collage.

For December, the Gallery will offer a recording of this presentation to view on demand, as well as displays of images and pieces from the performance. The collage, which is meant to be a collective expression of our thoughts, feelings, and hopes around guaranteed income and economic equity, will also be on display, and patrons are encouraged to add to the collage throughout the exhibit.
