Project Vision Statement


After many years of research, deliberations, and planning, the Olean Public Library's Board of Trustees and Administration are honored to unveil their new vision for the Library; a comprehensive strategy that addresses space, flexibility, safety, and technology improvements, as well as the other amenities that collectively create the premier community information and learning center of the greater Olean area. This \$7.9 Million investment will enhance and expand programming, resources,



and opportunities for patrons of all ages, abilities,

and backgrounds in a welcoming, safe, and supportive environment.

- First major renovation in over 50 years
- Most cost-effective option available
- Focus on building a better future for Olean's children and families
- Substantial improvement to Olean's cultural, educational, and workforce infrastructure
- Expanded re-designed modular gathering spaces address the overcrowding at community and family events, adding 7,590 square feet and remodeling 6,615 more
- · Increased safety and security measures for all library patrons
- Expansion and improvement to Children's Library, Teen Center, Olean History collections, and study areas
- Makerspace for community members of all ages to engage in learning new skills, emerging technologies, and participating in group projects
- Improved services for library patrons, including restrooms, baby-changing area, refreshments, and a
 permanent location for book and merchandise sales
- No major disruptions to services throughout the project


